

MedShare Wins Canadian Health Informatics Awards Project Implementation Team of the Year

On November 24, 2005 MedShare was awarded Project Implementation Team of the Year at the 2005 Canadian Health Informatics Awards Gala.

This prestigious award recognizes MedShare's achievement in implementing an Electronic Health Record (EHR) portal solution in the home health care sector. The award judges evaluated a number of project criteria, including excellence in communications, team effort, issues management and knowledge transfer. MedShare was judged to have delivered what was proposed, demonstrated that the project had been brought in on time and within budget, and utilized excellent change management and project management methodologies.

"This award is an honour to receive – and it reinforces our commitment to professional, client-centered project implementation," says Barry Billings, president of MedShare. "In this case it was our client's drive to improve access to information, reduce administrative burden and focus on client care that provided the impetus for change."
